
The New Cross in the Church in Newcastle Emlyn: will be blessed at Mass this Saturday Evening. The old Cross had been severely eaten by woodworm and was in very real danger of disintegrating and falling off the wall. The Corpus (the image of Jesus) was unharmed, as it is made from a much denser wood (too difficult for the woodworm to eat), so this has been mounted on a new cross made of oak. Christine Howells RIP asked that money be given in lieu of flowers for her funeral, and the proceeds would go towards Our Lady Queen of Peace Church, so the cross will be paid for from the money given in her name. Please keep the repose of her soul in your prayers, that she may enjoy the rewards of Faith. Amen.

St Bernard of Clairvaux: In the year 1111, at the age of 20, Bernard left his home to join the monastic community of Citeaux. His five brothers, two uncles, and some 30 young friends followed him into the monastery. Within four years, a dying community had recovered enough vitality to establish a new house in the nearby valley of Wormwoods, with Bernard as abbot. The zealous young man was quite demanding, though more on himself than others. A breakdown of health taught him to be more patient and understanding. The valley was soon renamed Clairvaux, the valley of light.

Bernard's life in the Church was more active than we can imagine possible today. His efforts produced far-reaching results. But he knew that they would have availed little without the many hours of prayer and contemplation that brought him strength and heavenly direction. His life was characterized by a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. His sermons and books about Mary are still in demand today.
